National perspective

- Havelock North system failure, Aug 2016
 - Drinking water contamination, campylobacter
 - 5000 people affected
 - Havelock North enquiry & findings, May & Dec 2017
- Reform of three waters system underway
- Related to, but separate from, the Essential Freshwater Programme
- Cabinet decisions late 2020









Regional Approach

- Compliance forums, ongoing
 - Data, monitoring, reporting (incl. incidents) and enforcement
- Four Waters 3 Waters + water quality, commenced 2015
 - Focused on resource consenting
 - Development of strategic approaches forward
- 2nd tier and Planning Managers, commenced 2019







Environment Southland Priorities

- LGA
 - Ongoing provision of good quality regulation and services (s10 & 11)
- 4 Waters wk. programme will be revived during 2020
 - Influenced by People, Water & Land Programme
 - Responds to the Values, Objectives and Limits over time
 - Connects councils LTPs, Asset Management Plans etc
 - Informs the content of Southland's next generation Policy / Plans
