

What goes into policy?











The policy cycle

RMA (Resource Management Act)

Before:

- LOADS of individual statutes including:
 - Soil Conservation and Rivers Control Act 1941
 - Water and Soil Conservation Act 1967


<u>Application elements include:</u>


- Policy → development of methods
- Consents → interpret and implement
- Compliance → enforcement

Key philosophies:

- Sustainable, integrated management of resources
- Public participation
- 'Effects-based' and 'activity-based'











Consents and Compliance

- Different kinds of resource consent and different activity statuses; and
- Consent applications processed in a number of ways;
